St Thomas à Becket, Ramsey e-Bulletin 23 November 2025

Dear Friends,

Christ the King is the feast that falls on the last Sunday of the church year, before the new advent year starts. It only came into being in 1925 and was originally set at the end of October. Changing it to the Sunday before the beginning of Advent corresponds well to the end of history when Christ returns as King.

So, who is Christ the King? Do you imagine a majestic, all-powerful king that we need to bow before because he has the authority? Do we see Jesus as a sort of spiritual super king? This is probably not surprising given how much of our worship focuses on this aspect.

But then the reading, this Sunday, from Luke 23:33-43 offers a very different picture. A challenging and bewildering image that does not reflect what we might imagine as being kingship:

- A naked and wounded body instead of one clothed in fine robes
- A crown of thorns: not one of gold and fine jewels
- Hands pierced with nails: not adorned with rings
- A wooden cross: no mighty throne.
- A cheap sign reading INRI (*Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudaeorum* Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews) instead of banners, golden images and all manner of pomp.
- A criminal on either side of him instead of courtiers and loyal subjects
- Jeering and mocking instead of cheering and respect

This is such a bleak picture of a dying man, but Jesus was not just any man. Pilate's wife recognised this and advised Pilate to have nothing to do with 'this innocent man'. But Pilate had a weak, vacillating personality which the

Jews probably took advantage of, and which landed him in trouble with Rome. Allegedly Pilate killed himself on orders from the emperor <u>Caligula</u> for cruelty, oppression and executing without a trial.

We know it was not the end, but the disciples didn't and they were gutted and bereft. Why wasn't Jesus using his power to save himself? How could this happen to an innocent man? How could a murdering insurgent be set free instead? No wonder they fled. We also know that there is another side to Christ the King – he is not aloof from the ordinary but knows what it is to experience betrayal and pain, cruelty and injustice, loneliness and death.

Christ uses his power to go through this for us and with us. And this is what

- brings hope and peace
- shows the true love of God
- demonstrates his transformative power
- epitomises a love that can even whisper in the shadow of death to a thief beside him, "Today you will be with me in paradise."

Jesus is a surprising king – a king of the marginalised and deeply human, beyond our understanding, worthy of our praise but always with us in the ups and downs of life. Love and blessings to you all $Sh\hat{a}n$
