5. *Receipt of reports: (All reports were published prior to the meeting and were available online, at the back of the Church and filed with these minutes.)*
 - a. *Electoral Roll Report*
Ian Bell-Berry, the Electoral Officer was unable to attend. This year involved a full revision of The Electoral Roll. Our current roll stands at 104.
 - b. *Annual Report on the proceedings of the PCC and the activities of the parish.*
Bellringers: Joe thanked the Bellringers, particularly for their participation in the recent VE 80 celebrations.

Children and Families: Hayley Challinor commented how good it is to see families attending more regularly.

Cleaning: Cathy Moulton stressed the need for more cleaning volunteers but was grateful to Tracey and Jeremy Summerell who have recently stepped in to help. She also thanked Lesley Barker for organising the big church cleans.

Craft Group: Shân thanked Rachel and Judith for running the Craft Group which is bringing in a lot of people not connected with the church.

Fundraising: Richard Hyde asked people to put the fundraising dates (displayed in the church porch) in their diaries. Many people from outside the church support these events but it would also be good to see more members of the congregation attending.

Men's Breakfast: Joe encouraged others to go.

Mission report: Martin stressed the strong support from the congregation for the work in Uganda. Many have supported children who have now become professional adults.

Music: Joe thanked Neville and others for their musical input to worship in the church.

Pastoral Report: Val Molloy was unable to attend the meeting. She is beginning training as an Anna Chaplain which is an authorised national ministry that the Ely Diocese participates in by training and commissioning chaplains in local contexts. They work specifically with the elderly and housebound.

There is now a small pastoral network who meet regularly to ensure that no one slips through the net and ensuring that the most vulnerable people in our church community are safe.

Toddler time: Pip Cadman reported that it is very encouraging to have so many parents and carers coming along to Toddlers. Numbers are growing so they may be putting in a request for another set of tables and chairs. There is also a Refresh group for parents and grandparents which is run termly – an adult version of Toddlers which offers a safe space to talk and ask questions. Rachel Thompson (a grandparent) offered thanks.

Flower group: thanked by Joe for stunning decorations at Easter.

Safeguarding Report: Joe offered thanks to Jane Cusworth for her role as Benefice Safeguarding Officer. Glennis Brown pointed out that all volunteers have undertaken Basic Safeguarding training. Rachel Thompson pointed out that Safeguarding is everyone's responsibility.

c. *Financial statements of the PCC for the year ending 31 December 2024*

Please refer to written report for more details. (Included in the Report Booklet). There are four accounts: day to day, restoration, re-ordering and the chancel account. In 22 years of Jeremy being treasurer, we have not spent any money from the chancel account.

It costs £1600 a week to run church. At present there is a shortfall of £32 a week. Jeremy gave thanks to all for their giving.

Our Ministry Share is £46,000.

He gave thanks to Judith Hyde for doing the banking.

Jane Cusworth enquired about the impact of the card machine. This paid for itself in 2 months. There are two or three payments made each week when the church is open to visitors.

Cathy Moulton asked why cheques are still being used. It was explained that cheques have to be used until new churchwardens can complete paperwork at the bank so that electronic payments can be made.

Joe gave thanks to Jeremy.

d. *Annual Fabric Report*

Lesley stressed that many people help to keep the church in good repair aside from the committee.

We are at the consultation stage to remove the pews, to replace the interior doors at the back with clear doors and to reposition the stained glass above it. The Victorian Society have visited and English Heritage also has a say.

There is a DAC meeting this Thursday.

There is a folder at the back of church with architect drawings if people wish to look. Joe is happy to listen to comments.

A smaller group of people has been set up to liaise with architects etc. which consists of David Paynter, Shan Oswald and Ian Bell-Berry.

Richard Hyde has asked for guidance so that money can be raised for a specific project as people are more likely to give.

Jane Cusworth asked if there is any timescale on the removal of the pews.

Shan explained it is all dependent on the DAC. There are many stages before anything can happen.

Cathy showed concern about what will happen between events when chairs have been moved for specific events. It was agreed that this would need thinking about once it has happened. Volunteers are needed in general for setting up etc. we need to try to increase the volunteer pool.

Samples of chairs have been at the back of church for us to try. However, our choice is limited by the C of E.

Shan reiterated that we will be able to cater for much larger numbers once the pews are removed which would also make the space much safer.

Joe gave thanks to everyone for the way in which he and his family have been welcomed to the Parish. They needed to be closer to Naomi's family and the welcome they have received has made such a huge difference to the whole family.

Joe thanked all those who do things – he noted that we are very active and vibrant and that it is the people who make the church what it is.

Future: vision and strategy. When Joe started, we were already on a journey. He was keen to not throw that out the door but to continue that work. Part of this has involved the Leading the Church into Growth Conference which was attended by 8 members of the PCC. From that, ideas have been brought together for how we might grow into the future. This thinking needs to come to the PCC as a new plan to grow the church. There 7 clear steps to form strategy with three forms of growth: Spiritually, Missionally and numerically.
