

St Thomas à Becket, Ramsey

Hello!

We're in that funny in-between time at church, where we've left Epiphany behind and Lent is just around the corner (join us on Ash Wednesday – 18th Feb - at 7:30pm!). We call it 'ordinary time', which sounds a bit bland like Ready Salted Crisps.

But there's nothing bland or ordinary about God's Church, and this Sunday we're exploring a text that I hope will help you realise your truest, fullest self in God who loves you, the extraordinary human you are – certainly not like Ready Salted Crisps! Though I'll let you choose whichever extraordinary flavour of crisps best suits you!

The passage is well known – Matthew 6:25-34 – part of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount, where he teaches his followers the most valuable of life-lessons. In chapter 6, he says: "Do not worry." Specifically, he's talking about physical resources and the preoccupation with meeting their most basic of human needs: food and clothing.

Our developed world is SO far removed from that, we depend more on delivery lorries with the latest stock take than we do on God to get food on our tables and clothes for our bodies. And yet it doesn't take much to disrupt our 'secure' way of life and ignite a frenzy of panic buying (I'm suddenly remembering the Pandemic and people stocking up on toilet roll, what was with that!?). It's a reminder that we really DO depend on God, though perhaps we're only conscious of it in our moments of need...

Jesus points to the birds, and the lilies, and tells the crowds that if God provides for the free-flying creatures, and clothes the flowers in such beauty, then how much more will God provide for your needs? "Indeed your Heavenly Father knows that you need all these things." (v32). ALL these things!

You might not be worried about where your next meal will come from (though spare a thought for those who do...), but we do worry. A lot.

About everything! But...God knows. Your fears, worries, preoccupations, whatever they are, they matter. God knows, and cares, because God loves. But God also invites us into a relationship of trust, creates a family (like a multi-pack of crisps with all the flavours!) whereby we 'seek the kingdom first', meeting one another's needs, physical and emotional.

It's worth a brief note here on the importance of differentiating between our day-to-day worries, and what can become debilitating mental illnesses, and we must always be conscious of stigma and unhelpful responses such as quoting this very passage (it doesn't help FYI – trust me, I know).

But in all cases, we can come to know God who loves us and cares deeply for us, releasing our fears into God's hands like a bird flying from a cage, we can look at each other, and ourselves in a mirror knowing that we carry the same beauty as the lilies of the field because God made us that way – regardless of how you see yourself.
