Dear Friends

Feet are vital – over an average lifetime we walk between 75,000 and 100,000 miles – and any problem with them can seriously affect our lives. Feet are probably not our best feature, and most of us are probably grateful that we don't have to wash visitors' feet as they did in Jesus's time. A few years ago, I remember Richard Darmody preaching about an incident that happened at a clergy conference he had attended-the theme of which was 'Feet and their biblical significance'. Richard said people were talking about the day over the evening meal and he shared that he had always had flat feet. At the end of the meal one of the ministers dragged him into a small room and began to pray over his feet – something he was not comfortable with. However, when he got to his room and looked, he had arches in his feet! He shared the story because, although he was the recipient of a miracle, he doubted it was real until his wife June confirmed it.

Just before he retired, I remember asking Richard if he still had arches – he did - and whether he had felt anything whilst the miracle was taking place, and he hadn't. I find it amazing that his bones were reshaped without his being aware of it. I wonder if that was the same for the people Jesus healed. At the end of August, four of us went to the Big Church Festival along with 35,000 Christians. Saturday night, dusk had started, the music was great, we were singing along when I suddenly became aware that the man, sat next to me, kept looking at the ground. Thinking he might have dropped something I glanced down and saw some dark staining on the grass. Then I looked a bit more and saw blood pouring out of his sandal. I asked him if he was aware that he was bleeding and he said he thought he had just spilt coffee on his foot!

I took the sandal off, grabbed wipes from my rucksack to clean his foot to see if he had cut himself. There was a LOT of blood and, remembering my first aid training, I assumed a varicose vein had popped and pressure was needed. After using up my pack of wipes, people passed tissues and even a t-shirt to help staunch the flow. Hayley went to get help and First Aiders eventually arrived – all I can say is I am glad I'm a bossy old woman!!. We swapped my emergency stuff for a sterile gauze whilst we waited for the

paramedics. The first aider shone a torch all over the foot and was amazed that he couldn't see where the blood had come from. Paramedics wheeled him off with a tightly bandaged foot and to our amazement he walked back 20 minutes later with no sign of any injury. He said he felt fine.

When we got back to our accommodation and chatted about what had happened, Val informed me that a couple behind had been praying over us all the time I had been helping the man. We were convinced that this had resulted in the healing.

So, miracles are still happening – even when people try to rationalise them away, they defy logic. Have you got any stories to share where the answer to prayer left you stunned? With love and blessings *Shân*
